The reputation built up by Kiddibank for being a high-quality nursery providing excellent service and education to its children, enables parents to allow their children to continue this education right through to age 14.

From age 3 the pupils at Cameron International Primary School can enjoy the benefits of a cross cultural education in a quality bilingual school.

About us

Cameron International Primary School is based at the prestigious San Roque Club in the province of Cadiz. It provides a high quality, bilingual education for children ages 3 years to 14 years old. The school boasts extended opening hours from 7.30am until 7pm. A large, safe play area for all the children to enjoy as well as a whole range of after school clubs, school bus pick-ups and drop offs and a healthy lunch menu cooked fresh every day.

Each class will be kept to a maximum of 20 pupils (16 in foundation) to ensure every child gets the time and help they need to thrive in their education. All our teachers are fully trained and have a wealth of experience from across the globe. Each lesson will be taught in English except for the language classes. Spanish lessons will of course be compulsory for each class, taught by our native Spanish teacher.

Our after-school programme will provide an ever-changing programme of activities including, language lessons, sports, cooking, arts and crafts and swimming.

The Curriculum

Cameron International Primary School will follow the International Primary Curriculum (IPC). The IPC is a comprehensive, thematic, creative curriculum for 3-14-year old, with a clear process of learning and with specific learning goals for every subject, for international mindedness and for personal learning.

The IPC has been designed to ensure rigorous learning but also to help teachers make all learning exciting, active and meaningful for children. Learning with the IPC takes a global approach; helping children to connect their learning to where they are living now as well as looking at the learning from the perspective of other people in other countries. The IPC is used by schools in more than 90 countries around the world.

That's why the IPC has over 130 different thematic units of learning; which tap into children's interests, are internally relevant, and help them to learn more about and engage positively with the world around them; themes include Who Am I? The Magic Toymaker, Active Planet, Young Entrepreneurs, Mission to Mars, and What Price Progress.

In addition to this the IPC has created a set of Brainwave units which help teachers and children learn about the philosophy, pedagogy and process of the IPC, helping introducing them to the IPC Personal Goals, international mindedness, self-reflection, metacognition and much more. Teachers love to kick off the school year with these units to ensure that children have a growth mind set for learning.

Organising units in around a theme helps children to see how subjects are both 'independent' and 'interdependent' enabling them to see 'the big picture' of their learning, make connections through and across different subjects, and talk about a theme from multiple perspectives. Learning tasks for each subject have been written offering a wealth of ideas for research and recording activities, which provide children with the opportunity to work collaboratively, practically, in and out of the classroom, using role play and learning from each other.

Each IPC unit incorporates a range of the different subjects, along with suggested links to Language Arts and Mathematics. In addition to our larger thematic units of work, we have also created some subject-focused units, which still follow the IPC process of learning, and include the IPC Personal Goals and international tasks. Examples include history-focused units, science-focused units and specialist units for ICT and Computing.

School Uniform Policy

Principles

Our policy is that all children should wear clothing that is in keeping with a purposeful learning ethos. We also believe that certain school activities are facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing (including organised events outside normal school hours).

Aims

- our policy is based on the belief that a school uniform:
- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- encourages a feeling of belonging
- is practical and distinctive
- identifies the children with the school
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothing might be)
- makes children feel equal to one another in terms of appearance
- reflects the sense both of community and of diversity that the school takes pride in
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents

School Uniform

All clothing should be clearly labelled with your child's name. This is especially important, as uniform items look similar and can easily be confused for another child's. The school cannot accept responsibility for any lost items.

All children (F1, 2, 3 & Year 1 – Year 8) need:

- blue Cameron International Primary School V-neck sweat shirt/sweatshirt cardigan
- white Cameron International Primary School polo t-shirt
- grey school trousers/skirt/pinafore dress
- grey socks with black flat sensible school shoes (shoes are to be plain with no coloured logos, plain black trainers are acceptable)
- in summer girls, may wear a blue gingham dress and boy's grey shorts

For PE all children (F1, 2, 3 & Year 1 – Year 8) need:

- white Cameron International Primary School T-shirt
- wavy blue PE shorts or track-suit bottoms
- plimsolls/trainers with white soles
- PE kits should be free from any logo or brand name, apart from the school logo.

Uniform can be ordered and purchased at the school office.

Jewellery and Headwear

On health and safety grounds, we do not allow children to wear jewellery to school (except for small studs and watches). We do not allow headwear to be worn during class time or inside school buildings, except for religious or medical reasons.

Role of the Class Teachers and Support Staff

- Set a good example in terms of dress.
- Remember that in our respective roles we serve the local community as a set of professionals.
- To remind children to wear school uniform. The class teacher will speak to children who do not wear the correct uniform. If they still are not wearing the uniform, they are to be referred to the Director.

Role of the Director

- The Director is to ensure that pupils comply with the uniform policy agreed by the governing body.
- The Director has a duty to enforce the school uniform throughout the school community, as part of the duty within maintenance of day to day discipline in the school.
- The Director will speak to the parents of children who persistently do not wear the correct uniform.

Role of the Parents/Guardians

- To ensure that their child / children adhere to the school's uniform policy.
- Ensure that they come to school in uniform everyday unless there are special circumstances such as non-uniform days.
- To ensure that all uniform is labelled correctly and clearly.

Package A will be for your child to attend Cameron International Primary School for the standard school hours of 08.50 until 16.00. This package **does not include** any childcare for any of the school holidays or bank holidays.

School lunches are not included and are charged at €5.00 per day.

A deposit of one month's fee is payable and a 25% discount is offered to siblings.

A school bus service is available at an extra cost and additional hours are available upon request, charged at an hourly rate.

A registration fee of €200 is payable upon application

€650 Per month payable September until June (10 months)

Package B

Package B will be for your child to attend Cameron International Primary School for the standard school hours of 08.50 until 16.00. This package **includes** additional childcare for all of the school holidays and bank holidays during the hours of 08.50 and 16.00

This fee is to be paid on a monthly basis for every month of the year, (12 months payable)

School lunches are not included and are charged at €5.00 per day.

A deposit of one month's fee is payable and a 25% discount is offered to siblings.

A school bus service is available at an extra cost and additional hours are available upon request, charged at an hourly rate.

A registration fee of €200 is payable upon application

€635 Per month payable every month of the year (12 payments)

Package C

Package C will be for your child to attend Cameron International Primary School for the standard school hours of 08.50 until 16.00. This package **includes** additional childcare for all of the school holidays and bank holidays during the hours of 08.50 and 16.00. This package also includes a healthy school lunch every day.

This fee is to be paid on a monthly basis for every month of the year, (12 months payable)

A deposit of one month's fee is payable and a 25% discount is offered to siblings.

A school bus service is available at an extra cost and additional hours are available upon request, charged at an hourly rate.

A registration fee of €200 is payable upon application

€738 Per month payable every month of the year (12 payments)

Package D

Package D will be for your child to attend Cameron International Primary School during the hours of 07.30 and 19.00. They will attend a breakfast club until school starts at 8.50am then an after-school club up until 7pm. This package **includes** all the school holidays and bank holidays.

This fee is to be paid on a monthly basis for every month of the year, (12 months payable)

School lunches are not included and are charged at €5.00 per day.

A deposit of one month's fee is payable and a 25% discount is offered to siblings.

A school bus service is available at an extra cost and additional hours are available upon request, charged at an hourly rate.

A registration fee of €200 is payable upon application

€842 Per month payable every month of the year (12 payments)

Package E

Package E will be for your child to attend Cameron International Primary School during the hours of 07.30 and 19.00. They will attend a breakfast club until school starts at 8.50am then an after-school club up until 7pm. This package **includes** all the school holidays and bank holidays.

This package also includes a healthy school lunch every day.

This fee is to be paid on a monthly basis for every month of the year, (12 months payable).

A deposit of one month's fee is payable and a 25% discount is offered to siblings.

A school bus service is available at an extra cost and additional hours are available upon request, charged at an hourly rate.

A registration fee of €200 is payable upon application

€930 Per month payable every month of the year (12 payments)

Package F

Package F will be for your child to attend Cameron International Primary School during the hours of 07.30 and 19.00. They will attend a breakfast club until school starts at 08.50 then an after-school club up until 19.00. This package **does not include** any childcare for any of the school holidays or bank holidays

This fee is to be paid on a monthly basis for every month of the academic year, September until June (10 monthly payments)

A deposit of one month's fee is payable and a 25% discount is offered to siblings.

School lunches are not included and are charged at €5.00 per day.

A school bus service is available at an extra cost and additional hours are available upon request, charged at an hourly rate.

A registration fee of €200 is payable upon application

€848 Per month payable September until June (10 months)
